ORGANIZATION

On October 15, 1968, a meeting was held at the Grand Hotel at Point Clear, Alabama, for the purpose of organizing a forum for the discussion of admiralty and maritime law, and its practice and administration, among practitioners in the ports of the Southeastern United States. With the full endorsement of those in attendance, the Southeastern Admiralty Law Institute was then founded and subsequently incorporated "to promote higher professional standards and better methods in the practice of maritime law."

In furtherance of its stated goals, SEALI has emerged as a national leader in Continuing Education in admiralty and maritime law through its annual seminar. Since the first seminar in 1969, this event has enjoyed a well deserved reputation as practical, thorough and topical. In addition to annual reviews of recent developments in the Fifth Circuit, the Eleventh Circuit and Supreme Court, and the Fourth and remaining circuits, papers are given on subjects including maritime personal injury, the LHWCA, cargo damage, maritime liens, pollution, and admiralty jurisdiction. The oral presentations on these topics are given by leading admiralty attorneys and accompanied by lengthy, well researched written materials.

For more than a decade, the Institute has also published an Admiralty Deskbook for the federal judiciary in the region. Other activities include a quarterly newsletter for the membership and special projects relating to the practice of admiralty and its future.

Regular membership in the organization is limited to attorneys admitted to practice in the states of Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Florida, Georgia, Alabama, Tennessee, Mississippi, Louisiana, Texas and Maryland, who are interested in the practice of admiralty law. Attorneys from other states are eligible for non-resident membership, and any citizen of the United States who is not an attorney but who is engaged in a maritime or maritime-related occupation or activity is eligible for associate membership. The Institute currently has over 650 members.
